PROBUS CANADA CITATION AWARDS Presentations made at Kay Meek on 15 May, 2023

The Probus Canada Citation Award honours Probus members who have had a lasting effect on their Club. The recipients of this award are minimum five-year Probus members who inspire commitment, set a bench mark for others, and demonstrate ongoing club sustainability. Club Presidents submit recommendations for those meeting those standards to the Probus Canada Board of Directors for approval.

While there are many members who have contributed greatly to the club, and who may qualify for this award, Carolyn Armstrong recommended two members that she felt brought the greatest sustainability towards building a strong future for our Probus Club of North Shore Vancouver.

The first Citation Award was awarded to Joan McLeod. Joan has been a member since 2015 and served for 3 years as the Speaker Program Chair. She brought a varied and noteworthy mix of speakers to the club's monthly events. When COVID hit, Joan had to pivot from hosting speakers at in-person meetings to ZOOM, at the same time learning a new technology for these meetings. She was able to successfully continue the Speaker series with a member participation of 100 to 120 at each session.

During Covid, the Club was notified that its current meeting location at Capilano Golf Club was no longer available to us. Joan led a group of members who undertook a search for a new suitable and affordable meeting facility on the North Shore. Joan is a volunteer at the Kay Meek Arts Centre and was instrumental in getting a rental agreement for the Club's 2021-2022 year. Even though Joan stepped down as Speaker Chair, she continued to work as a liaison with Kay Meek and assist the new Chair with bookings for the fall of 2021.

A Probus Citation Award is merited for Joan McLeod's organizational skills, adaptability and hard work above and beyond which contributed to our Club's continued success through the tough COVID times and with our new venue at Kay Meek.

15 May, 2023 – Dr. Paul Evans "New Dimensions of the China Challenge for Canada" There was a good turnout of 143 members and guests to hear Dr. Evans talk on the changing geopolitics of China. He stated that the United States and China are the top two most powerful nations in the world right now and are intricately interwoven through trade and economies. China is the top trading partner for 126 countries in the world. China has only grown stronger economically and in build-up of military arms, while the US is slipping with its fractured political system and trade deficits.

Dr. Evans spoke of the US and China now entering into a Cold War 2. Cold War 1 was a dark time with fear of nuclear fallout between the Soviet Union and the US in the 1950's, with the US coming out on top as the Soviet Union collapsed. This Cold War 2 is different as it is a competition for control of select advanced technologies through research and development in areas of artificial intelligence, communications, energy, use of rare earth elements and advanced semi-conductor production. He referred to the US and China as adversaries and not enemies. While China has stolen and copied other countries' technology, it has also advanced its own research and development sponsored by the state.

In referencing the recent news on interference by China in Canada and the US, he said it has resulted in universities and research institutes pulling back on collaboration with Chinese universities on specific technologies. Also, restrictions have been imposed on export of specific technologies to China. Foreign interference is undertaken by many countries in Canada, he noted the US, India, Thailand, Singapore and Israel. While each country goes about it differently, China crossed a line in threatening a Canadian MP's family members located in China, resulting in a diplomate expulsion and retaliation. The biggest effect of China and other countries' interference comes in the political nomination process. While US and Canada have interests in spreading its views on democracy and humanitarian causes, China seeks to strengthen its own authoritarian rule and relations with other authoritarian regimes.

Dr. Evans used the metaphor of China/US/Canada relations being in the dead of winter, dark and chilly. But spring could be coming as there are some recent indications of light in future relations, being noted in recent US and Canada high level meetings with China.

27 April, 2023 VanDusen Garden Tour

It was a gorgeous sunny day, perfect for touring the spring flowering trees and gardens at VanDusen Gardens. 32 Probus ladies and guests participated with a golfcart for 5 ladies and the rest in 2 groups with volunteer guides. VanDusen is 55 acres of gardens cared for by only 7 gardeners, each gardener looking after a geographic assigned area such as tree and plant species from Asia, South America, Mediterranean, New Zealand/Australia and local.

Our guide, Peter, who is a tree specialist, pointing out unique identifiers of the tree species and their origins. Some brave members even successfully walked the maze. The colours of the flowers and tree blossoms were spectacular in the spring sun.

Introducing New members of the Management Committee




Judith Berg - incoming Speaker Program Co-Chair
