Meeting at West Vancouver Yacht Club – Please Note

DAY of Meeting CHANGED TO TUESDAY – IMPORTANT

Tuesday 20th February, 2024, at 10:00 with refreshments at 9:15 am Speaker: Dr. Hilary Letwin, West Vancouver Art Museum Speaking about the great Canadian landscape architect – the late Cornelia Hahn Oberlander

As we mentioned in the January newsletter, due to major construction underway at the West Vancouver High School for the new track and field facilities until the winter of 2025, the parking lots are now closed during the daytime for the foreseeable future. The Spring speakers sessions of our Probus Club have therefore been relocated to the West Vancouver Yacht Club.

The monthly meeting dates will remain the same except for this month now being held on Tuesday 20 February and the May meeting. The meeting costs including room rental and refreshments are similar to those at Kay Meek, so there should be no change to our budgets. We will continue meetings at WVYC through to June and reconsider venue options going into next year, and with the potential of returning to Kay Meek when parking is available again.

Parking is available at the WVYC. There is parking in front of the club house and just to the west of the sailing school smaller building. There is also lots of parking at Thunderbird Marina, east of the Yacht club, but it is a bit of a walk along Marine Drive and no sidewalk. There is also a smaller parking lot at the marina just west of the yacht club, shorter walk along Marine Drive, again no sidewalks. We encourage members to

carpool. Another alternative is the West Vancouver Blue 250 bus which stops right outside the WVYC. Travelling by car on the Upper Levels Highway, take Exit 2, Eagleridge Drive down to Marine Drive, turn left on Marine Drive to the Yacht Club.

Dr. Hilary Letwin, West Vancouver Art Museum – Tuesday February 20, 2024 WV Yacht Club

Title: Genius Loci: An Introduction to the Landscape Architecture of Cornelia Hahn Oberlander

Cornelia Hahn Oberlander (1921-2021) was among the most eminent landscape architects in the world, known for many projects in Canada and abroad. Her landscape designs demonstrate her desire to create terrains that are less an interruption and more an amplification of what already exists on a site. This talk will highlight a selection of her projects, including residential projects, her large public projects, such as the roof of the Vancouver Public Library, and her playgrounds, including that designed for Expo'67 in Montreal.



Hilary Letwin is one of two co-curators for *Genius Loci: Cornelia Hahn Oberlander*, an exhibition copresented from 2021 to 2023 by the West Vancouver Art Museum and the Art Gallery of Alberta, supported by Heritage Canada. The exhibition has been shown in West Vancouver, Edmonton, Winnipeg, and Toronto. Letwin gained her PhD in Art History from Johns Hopkins University in 2013. She has held Curatorial Fellowships at the British Museum and the Baltimore Museum of Art. Recent projects include *Losing Control of the Landscape: Ross Penhall* (2023), *Douglas Coupland: Rabbit Lane* (2022), *Design for Living: West Coast Modern Homes Revisited* (2019); *Saints, Sinners and Souvenirs: Italian Masterworks on Paper* (2019); and *Molly Lamb Bobak: Talk of the Town* (2018). She currently works as the Museum Administrator/Curator at the West Vancouver Art Museum.

Summary of Fran McDougall's talk on Monday 15 January, 2024

Ms. Fran McDougall, ACT 2 Child and Family Services

Our speaker in January has a close connection to Vi Roden, a member of the Probus Management Committee, and it was fitting that Vi was asked to introduce Fran McDougall, the current Executive Director of ACT 2 Child and Family Services. This not-for-profit organization was founded by Vi Roden and Charmaine Atkinson in 1980 when their experience with supporting women in the correctional system led them to fully understand the extent and the impact that sexual abuse was having on women and children.

ACT 2 Child and Family services is chiefly funded through the Provincial Ministry of Children and Family Development, and BC Housing. It was well supported by the Federal Government, particularly through the COVID shut down of 2020-2022 when it received funding from the Federal Government through Women's Shelters Canada.

ACT 2 operates primarily in the Tri-Cities, Surrey, Ridge Meadows and Maple Ridge. Its major programs include:

- A family program providing short-term services to parents whose children are involved with the Ministry's child protection services
- A Transition House Program for women and children who have fled family violence
- A Homeless Prevention Program, and
- A Clinical Counselling Program

Their staff also accompany clients at court appearances and provide guidance to get their clients the supports they need.

One local North Vancouver design company is helping in the renovation of the transition house suites by volunteering labour and also by repurposing working fixtures which are being removed from houses being remodelled and renovated.

Probus members asked whether they could donate clothing, equipment or furniture to ACT 2 but Fran indicated that space to store these items is simply not available. However another Probus member, Ruby Finkbeiner, mentioned that Family Services of the North Shore located on the second floor of Capilano Mall is a resource for donations, and also for volunteer time locally https://www.familyservices.bc.ca/.
