20 January Speaker – Allan McMordie North Shore Search and Rescue

This presentation will provide information on the search and rescue operations the NSS&R perform in mountain, canyon and urban settings.

Allan McMordie has been an Active Member of North Shore Rescue for 45 years. He is a Search Manager, responsible for organizing the team during a task, and has been on the helicopter flight rescue team and a rope rescue team leader.



Allan has been on most trails and peaks of the North Shore, and down most of the gullies – where you DO NOT want to be.

In his talk, Allan will talk about the North Shore Rescue Team, its history and volunteer members. He will also give some tips for staying safe while enjoying our North Shore mountains. There will, of course, be many stories told of past rescues and an opportunity to ask questions.
